Desperate Search for Stolen Penguin

- 1 A search is taking place for a penguin that was stolen and then released by students into the wild in South Africa.
 - 2 Buddy, an African penguin, was released by students protesting about animals in zoos. The students had no plans to hurt the bird, but the penguin is in great danger as it won't be able to survive in the wild.
 - 3 Bayworld in South Africa, the marine park where Buddy lives, thinks that he can only survive for three weeks. Park staff are searching the coast, hoping that they will find Buddy.
 - 4 Dylan Bailey, manager of the park, said that it would be difficult for Buddy to survive in the wild because he was born in the park. He also said that Buddy was a very healthy penguin, in fact he was quite fat, and this would help him to live for a few weeks.
 - 5 Staff only discovered that the penguin was missing when they looked for him to examine him.
 - 6 CCTV showed two students climbing into the penguin pool, stealing Buddy and putting him into the boot of a car. They then drove a short distance to the sea where they let him swim away. The students are around age twenty but their names have not been released.
 - 7 Buddy was part of a pair that were looking after two newborn chicks. Since he disappeared one of the chicks has died, although park staff don't know if this was a related event. Buddy's mate Francis is not able to leave the nest, as her partner is not there to help with the chicks.
 - 8 There are now less than 20,000 pairs of African penguins that are breeding in the wild. A successful match like that of Buddy and Francis is important to make sure the species survives. If Buddy isn't found, it would be almost impossible to find Francis another partner.

- 9 Mr Bailey explained that penguins only have one partner for life. He said that if they couldn't get Buddy back, they would try to match Francis to another bird, but it might not be successful.
 - 10 Mr Bailey said that he was hopeful that Buddy would come back to the beach before he became too weak.
 - 11 Buddy is not the first penguin that was stolen. In 2012, two British tourists stole a penguin from an Australian theme park and were fined \$1,000 AUD (£640) each. The tourists took the penguin to their hotel room after they had drunk too much at a party.
 - 12 Elsewhere last week, a couple in a town in Peru found a penguin in their kitchen after they heard loud noises in the night. The couple thought there was a burglar downstairs but it was just the animal looking for food.
